

## Cat & Dog Registrations – Information for Owners





## How much does a Registration cost?

	1 year	3 years	Lifetime
Sterilised	\$20.00	\$42.50	\$100.00

Working Dog	1/4 of the registration fee.		
Pensioner	1/2 of the registration fee.		

A Pensioner Concession can only be applied if you have presented a current, valid Pensioner Concession Card, State Concession Card, Veteran's Card, or Seniors Card with a Commonwealth Seniors Card.

Sterilised rates will only be applied if you have presented at least one of the following:

- A Certificate of Sterilisation, issued by a Veterinary Clinic.
- A Signed Statutory Declaration.
- A Shire Officer sighting the dog's ear tattoo and confirming the sterilisation.

A dog that has been declared as a Dangerous Dog, Restricted Breed, or Commercial Security Dog incurs a flat fee of \$50.00. Concessions do not apply to these, and registrations must be renewed annually.

The cost for the registration of a Working Dog (a dog bona fide used in the droving or tending of stock) is 25% of the fee that would otherwise be payable.

## What else do I need to know?

An unsterilised cat may only be registered for 1 year, at a rate of \$100.00 (Pensioner Rate is applicable). Please note that an unsterilised cat that would be used for breeding requires approval from your local government, and must be declared when registered.

All dogs and cats that are over the age of three (3) months old must be both registered and microchipped. If you are updating your pet's ownership, or transferring your pet into the Shire, you will need to ensure that you have updated their microchip details *before* submitting a registration form.

If there is a change in your pets details, ranging from the changing of ownership, address, or if they pass away, you *must* notify the Shire as soon as possible to ensure that the registration information is up to date. Additionally, you may receive a registration renewal notice for an animal that you no longer own.

All registrations are due for renewal on 31 October annually. Make a note of the registration option you chose, so you know when to get in touch with us and when to expect a renewal notice.

Registrations and microchipping are essential in keeping your pet safe. If they were to become lost, it would allow for easy identification for a Ranger that collects it, and therefore your furry friend will be returned to you sooner.
