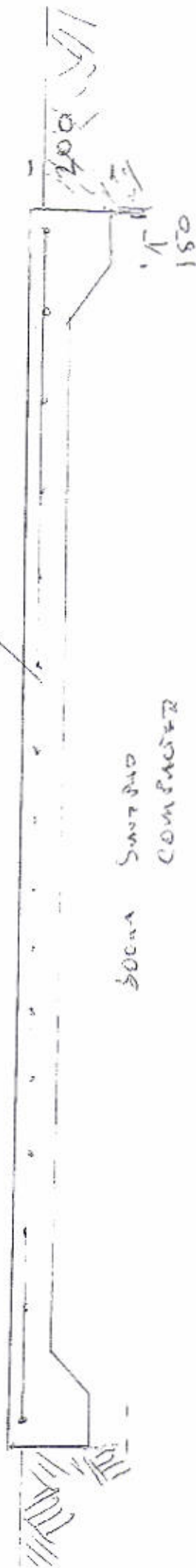

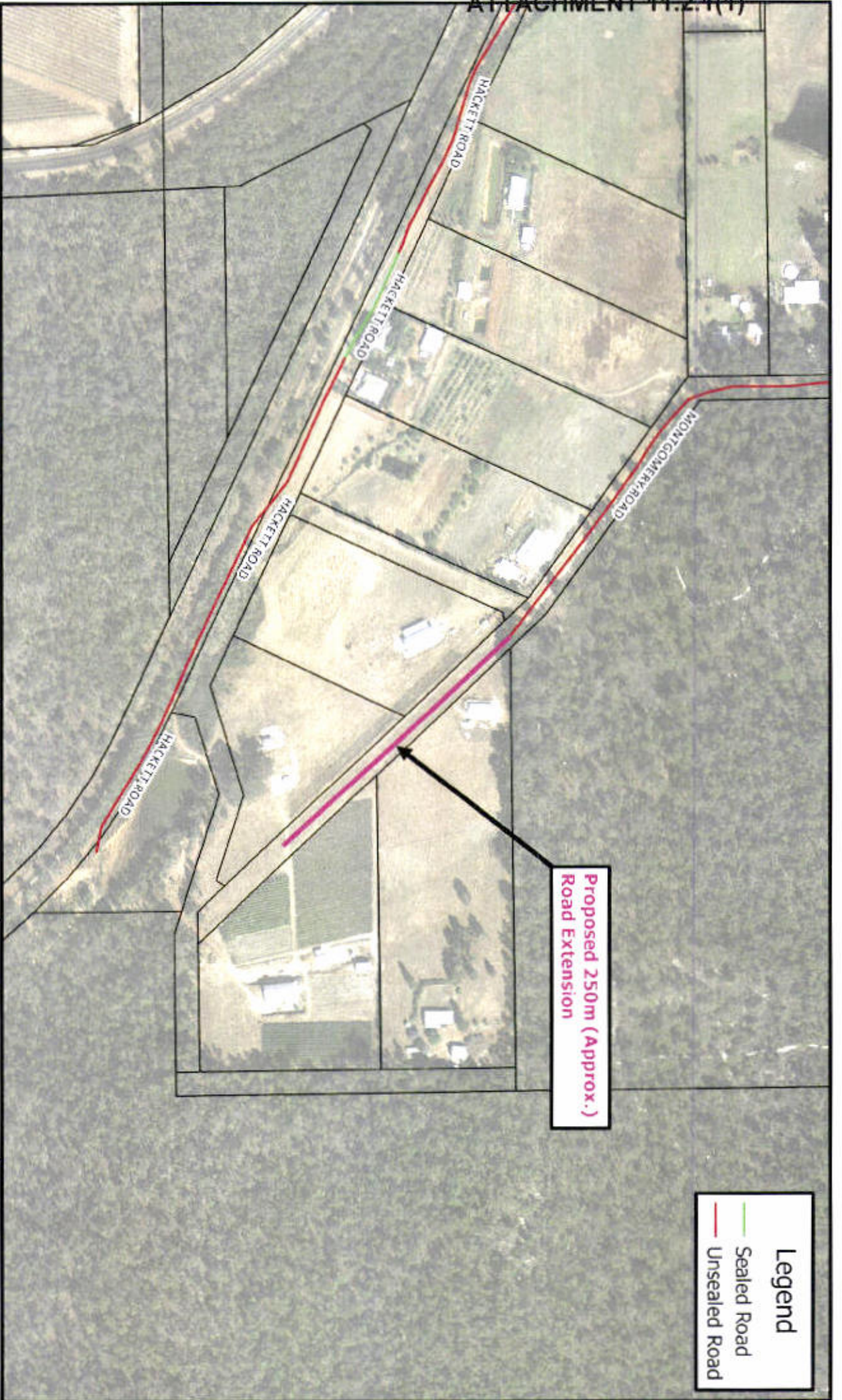

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Executive Summary

Two Men's Shed groups in Donnybrook are both occupying premises now needed for other purposes.

They are happy to amalgamate, and it is proposed to construct a new, purpose-built shed combining the requirements of both groups.

In order to allow funding applications and detailed planning to progress, the Shire of Donnybrook-Balingup has commissioned this project plan.

The critical project milestone that will allow other tasks to proceed is a committed decision from the Shire on which of several candidate locations will be assigned for the new shed.

A very preliminary budget of somewhat over \$500,000 would be prudent at this stage, pending further design work and tendering.

The project is feasible, desirable, cost-effective, and supports adopted objectives and strategies of both the Shire and the South West Development Commission.

Background

Across Australia and elsewhere, the Men's Shed movement, originating in the 1990s, has attracted thousands of members. It has achieved widespread recognition for contributing to men's health, physical and psychological, as well as to hundreds of host communities.

Two Men's Shed groups formed in Donnybrook some years ago, and catered for different areas of interest: woodworking and mechanical/metalworking. They have occupied separate premises and conducted their activities separately, although with some overlapping membership.

Both premises will become unavailable shortly, and the Shire, with the agreement of both groups, wishes to amalgamate the two clubs and provide them with a new, purpose-built facility.
