

Important/Notable Competition Rules

Below is a more detailed list of some of the important rules for mixed netball and this competition.

- Players must not be wearing any piece of clothing that could endanger the safety of other players or themselves, for example:
 - Body piercings or earrings.
 - No communication devices.
 - Fingernails must be short and smooth.
 - o Hair must be tied back.
- A player must pass or shoot within 3 seconds.
- A player may not kick the ball or strike the ball with a fist.
- A player in possession may not drag or slide their landing foot.
- A player is not out of court if any part if their body is on the goal or side line, but not over it.
- A player must not engage in physical contact that unfairly interferes with an opponent's play at the ball which results in:
 - o Loss of the ball by opponent in possession.
 - Interference with the passing or shooting action of an opponent in possession.
 - A change in body position of opponent and prevents their ability to move freely.
- A player that is defending must be 3 feet away from their opponent, which is measured from the landing foot of the player in possession to the nearest foot of the defender.
- A throw-in from outside of the court must be taken with one foot within 15cm of the line.
- The defending player may not cause the goal post to move to interfere with a shot or deflect a ball on its downward flight towards the ring.
- A player may not fall on the ball to gain possession and may not gain possession while lying or sitting on the ground.
- Centre pass must be taken within 3 seconds and touched within the centre third.
- Centre must have one foot inside the centre circle when making the centre pass, which is taken alternatively by each team.
- A goal must be scored from anywhere within the goal circle, including the lines.
